After Completing Prayer (Salāh)



Allāhum-ma a-'in-nee 'a-lā dhik-ri-ka wa shuk-ri-ka wa hus-ni 'E-bā-da-tik

O Allāh! Help me to remember You, and to be thankful to You, and to worship You in the best manner.¹

The text of the Hadeeth:

On the authority of Mu'ādh Bin Jabal (may Allāh be pleased with him): That the Messenger of Allāh (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam) took him by his hand one day and said: O Mu'ādh! By Allāh! Indeed I love you, and I advise you, O Mu'ādh, never leave off saying these words at the end of every prayer: 'O Allāh! Help me to remember You, and to be thankful to You, and to worship You in the best manner.'²

Shaykh Abdur-Razzāq Bin Abdul-Mu<u>h</u>sin Al-'Abbād (may Allāh preserve both him and his father) [after placing this supplication under the title of *what is said after the completion of the Salāh*] says: "The scholars of Islām have **two** views concerning whether this supplication is recited *before* or *after* the *Tasleem* (i.e. saying: 'As-Salāmu 'Alaikum wa Ra<u>h</u>matul-lāh...'). Shaykh-ul-Islām Ibn Taymiyyah is of those who hold the view that it is said *before Tasleem*. And Allāh knows best."

Explanation of the Hadeeth:

The saying of the Prophet (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam): "A-'in-nee" means: seeking Allāh's 'Awn (help) or *Is-ti-'ā-nah*, like in Al-Fāti<u>h</u>ah (1:5), "...*Wa Iy-yāka nas-ta-'een*" (...and You Alone we ask for help). Indeed, there is no success without *help* from Allāh!

His saying (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam): " 'A-lā dhik-ri-ka" (to remember You): Comprises all types of *Thanā* (praise, glorification), including recitation of *Qur'ān* and occupying oneself with Islamic knowledge by studying and teaching.

The reason why *Dhikr* (remembrance) is mentioned before *Shukr* (thankfulness, gratitude) is because a person will not be *thankful* if he does not first *remember* the One who deserves to be *thanked*.

In this same way *Dhikr* (remembrance) is mentioned before *Shukr* (thankfulness, gratitude) in the saying of Allāh, the Most High:

فَاذْكُرُونِي آذْكُرُكُمْ وَٱشْكُرُواْلِي وَلَا تَكْفُرُونِ (

Therefore remember Me (by praying and glorifying); I will remember you. And be thankful to Me (for My countless favors on you) and never be ungrateful (to Me). (2:152)

His saying (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam): "Wa shuk-ri-ka" (And to be thankful to You): Ash-Shukr (gratitude, thankfulness) is by means of the heart by acknowledging and confessing to the favors and bounties of Allah; then by means of the tongue by mentioning the favors of Allah and praising Him for them; then by means of the limbs of the body by obedience to Allāh, compliance with His commands and avoiding His prohibitions.

By being thankful and grateful, the blessings and favors of Allah, which one presently enjoys, will remain; and those which one does not have, may be added as an increase to what he already has. Allah, the Most High, said:

وَإِذْ تَأَذَّبَ رَبُّكُم لَبِن شَكَرْتُمُ لَأَنِيدَنَّكُمُ وَلَبِن كَفَرْثُمُ إِنَّ عَذَابِي لَشَدِيدُ ()

And (remember) when your Lord proclaimed: If you are thankful (by accepting faith and worshipping Allāh, Alone), I will give you more (of My blessings); but if you are ungrateful; verily, My punishment is indeed severe. (14:7)

His saying (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam): "Wa hus-ni 'E-bā-da-ti-k" (and to worship You in the best manner): Here the worship is qualified by the word 'Hus-ni' (i.e., that it be done in the best manner) since only the worship which is performed in its best manner will be considered as 'E-bā-dah khā-li-sah (i.e., worship done sincerely for Allāh, Alone). And if any worship is not done sincerely for the sake of Allah, Alone - as well as in accordance with the Sunnah of the Prophet (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam) - then it will not be accepted by Allah, nor will it benefit the one who performs it.
